22nd Medical Team Visit Jacsonville By Temrah Okonski, PT

This was the fifth visit to Jacsonville by Physical Therapist, Temrah Okonski. Temrah is the only physical therapist servicing this community. Temrah is most proud of the fact that when she treats an "old" patient his/her complaints are often different from the prior session, as injuries healed after treatment. Ailments seen most commonly are related to the hard labor that this community endures to include farming, carrying water and transporting goods to and from the market. Injuries to the ankles, knees, and back are common. Temrah treats with a range of manual techniques to include joint mobilization, myofascial work, and postural reeducation. Pediatric patients, though not as plentiful as adult patients also visit the clinic. Temrah treated a number of interesting pediatric patients to include the young girl who incurred burns to her hand. She also worked with two toddlers with leg length discrepancies. When left untreated this asymmetry could lead to scoliosis (curved back). In order to insure continuity of care and to mentor villagers interested in physical therapy, Temrah had

been teaching Sandra, a resident of Jacsonville, massage therapy. Sandra has trained with Temrah over her past five visits to Jasconsville. This diverse team saw a total of 308 patients.

Completion of Medical Clinic Building

completing the work on the new clinic building. As an architect I was impressed by how much has already been done, by the simplicity of the building methods and by how inexpensive it would be to complete the work necessary



to make the building usable. The primary spaces need only electrical work, plumbing,

doors, windows and some basic finishes. Labor and materials in Haiti are relatively inexpensive. Work in Jacsonville is free of the normal red tape and delays we would have in the US so that money could go directly to the construction work. I was able to draw an accurate plan of the building, visit suppliers, review work with subcontractors and meet with community leaders in Jacsonville to plan the work. The pharmacy, storage room, office, 2 exam rooms and a toilet room could be completed for a relatively small amount of money giving the medical team a base of operations. Completion of the lab, x-ray, inpatient and on-call rooms could be phased in later. As president of the Ellicott City Rotary Club I have been organizing an effort to help. Stay tuned!





Beer 'n Brats Fundraiser

By: Ed Ready, JD Becoming aware of the great need of Sante Total to provide a climate controlled, rodent free, medical supply room, complete with refrigerator, the Knights of Columbus at Mater Dolorosa Catholic Church in New Orleans, LA set up and had a successful fundraiser called "Beer 'n Brats" (an Oktoberfest themed event) on October 29, 2015. We are hoping to build a climate controlled and sealed room (and possibly refrigeration by putting in solar panels and if enough funds are raised finished floors in the Mission house). The fundraising goal was \$15,000. The initial hope was that this event would raise \$2,000 of that goal.

At the event there was a turnout of over a hundred people of all ages from the Parish

and Neighborhood. Everyone had fun and I spoke to the group about my experience in Haiti. We had 20 or so Knights of Columbus on hand who put in a lot of hard work putting this event together and whose efforts and generosity should be praised.



The foodstuffs and beers were donated by 4 local breweries, (40 Arpent, Crescent City Brewhouse, Nola Brewery, and Second Line Brewery) local food vendors (Crescent City Meats and Leidenheimers), and as well as the generosity of individual Knights of Columbus. The Knights of Columbus put on the event and cooked the delicious food.

We have received, as of this moment, \$5,286 in sales and donations to Sante Total for the proposed work. So obviously we surpassed that original goal of \$2,000. One of the local breweries, who had donated a keg, was impressed by this event and has also expressed interest in doing their own event to benefit Sante Total. The Knights of Columbus are coordinating that event as I write.
